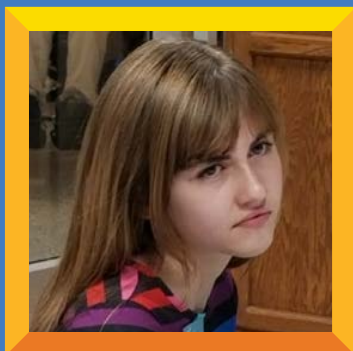

## Exceptional Students Thrive at St. Lillian

**When Chanler Holden was first searching for a school for her son, Wiley, St. Lillian didn't exist. In fact, Chanler couldn't find a school that offered the right mix of support services and education for him. So along with several other dedicated parents and future school leaders like Elissa McKenzie, she set out to start one.**



"We just kept talking with each other and saying, there's got to be something in Baton Rouge," she says. "Surely, there's a school in Baton Rouge for our kids. But there just wasn't. So we decided to start one, and St. Lillian Academy was born."

The effort took several long years and involved traveling across the country in search of other schools that could serve as models for the type of education parents and founders wanted to see at St. Lillian.

"Gary Solomon was always there to support us," says Chanler. "He was inspired by St. Michael Special School in New Orleans and wanted to see that kind of unique educational environment in Baton Rouge, one where all students could grow to their fullest potential."

In 2011 the school opened its doors. Wiley was among the very first students.

**"We started him in the first class, and I've been thankful for St. Lillian ever since," says Chanler.**

The integrated support services, combined with an emphasis on spiritual education and a family-like community, have been instrumental in Wiley's growth and development, she says.

"It turned our life around," Chanler says. "Being part of the St. Lillian community, that's when all of the gears started to move for Wiley, and each year has been smoother and smoother."

**"Wiley has grown immeasurably at St. Lillian. He wouldn't be where he is without the school," says Chanler. "It's the school we dreamed of for him all those years ago."**

Wiley, now 21 years old, is hoping to graduate in 2025. Like many twenty-somethings, he loves watching videos on YouTube. He also loves swimming and being in the water, whether it's at the pool, the beach or the lake. He enjoys spending time with his grandfather, who collects books to give to him, and going to the movies with his brother. He loves babies and lights up around them. He hopes to one day work as a caregiver, taking care of infants who bring him so much joy.

## Careful Planning Led to a Successful Combining of Schools

For students with unique education support needs, change can be especially challenging. But at St. Lillian, our goal is to ensure that every student feels safe, secure and supported each and every day.

That's why our decision to combine with Hope Academy in 2023 needed to be handled with careful, considered planning that would ensure that all students' needs at both schools continued to be met.

"The boards realized that we had two schools serving the same population of students with unique education support needs with very similar missions and approaches," says Veronica Crow, long-time parent and chair of the board.

**It was clear that by pooling the resources and expertise of the schools, we could create even more opportunities for all of the students the schools serve."**

The decision to combine the schools wasn't taken lightly. "Our Transition Task Force, our school leadership team, and our faculty and staff have worked tirelessly throughout last academic year and over the summer to ensure that the schools were ready to operate and serve our students at the highest level when our doors opened in August," says Veronica.

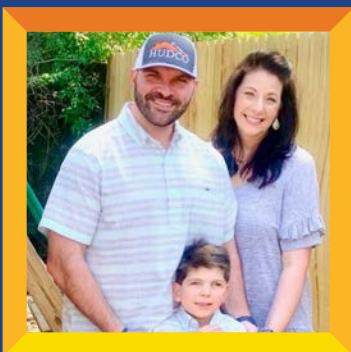
The result has been a smooth transition to a combined school operating on two campuses. "For students and parents, the process has largely been seamless," she says. "We have maintained all of our staff and faculty, with the exception of one teacher who retired. So from the students' perspective, they still have their support staff and teachers that they had before, and that's created a lot of continuity for them."

Remaining on both campuses this year has allowed the school to ease into the transition. "Our community has really embraced our new combined school," she says. "And they seem to be thriving."

Looking ahead, the school plans to relocate in the near future to a new school home, one that can accommodate the entire school population of 127 students. And one that has room for the school to provide even more educational and support programs and opportunities for its students.

"Our goal for the next phase is to grow our post-secondary education program to support our students in finding vocational opportunities that match their skills and interests," says Veronica.

**With stronger resources and a larger community, we hope to become the hub for this type of exceptional education in Baton Rouge so that every student can grow into their full potential and lead lives of meaning and purpose."**

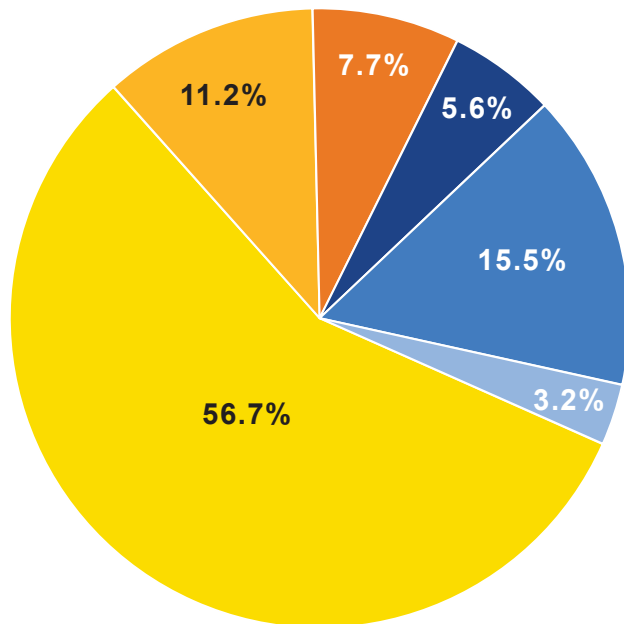

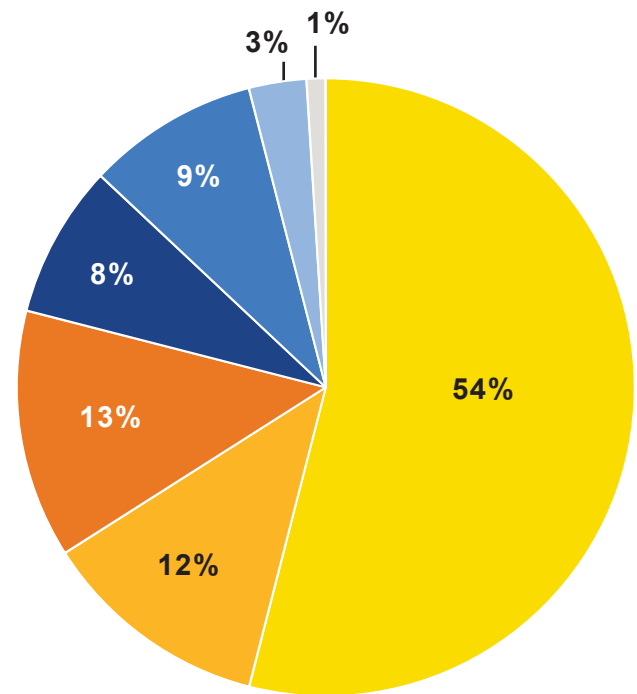

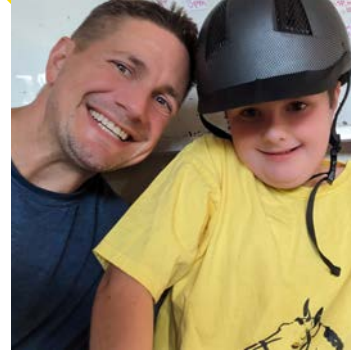

## St. Lillian's Inclusive Community Meets Students Where They Are

Charlotte Bencaz's son Asher began school while they were living in the Orlando Metro area. Despite the fact that Orlando is one of the largest metro areas in the country, they struggled to find a school that would meet the unique needs of her son, who is autistic and nonverbal.



"We toured 20 to 25 schools in the Orlando metro area within a 60-mile radius and didn't find anything like St. Lillian, with its model of a highly personalized education environment blended with support and therapy services in the classroom," she says.

**"We felt so blessed when we moved to Baton Rouge and discovered St. Lillian."**

Asher, a gentle soul who finds so much joy in simple things, loves the water so much that last winter, when it turned too cold to swim in the family pool, he took six baths a day just so he could play in the water.

His teacher, Ms. Melissa, has been a godsend, says Charlotte. "I hear horror stories all the time about what parents have to fight for to advocate for their children, how they have to shout at the top of their lungs just to get the services and support and accommodations they need. But our experiences with teachers like Ms. Melissa at St. Lillian have been so different from that."

Whether it's supporting Asher through trial-and-error medication changes, giving him coping tools to manage frustration, or helping him with toilet training, St. Lillian has been there every step of the way, she says, creating an environment set up for his success.

Charlotte says that work has paid off in big ways and small ways for Asher and his family. Recently, as he began his 5th year at the school, she watched her son calmly walk out of the building to carpool all by himself. For parents of children without education support needs, that might seem like any other day. But for Charlotte, who has watched her son struggle with elopement for years, it represents St. Lillian's dedication to meeting students where they are—and providing the support and nurturing care they need to get where they need to go.

**"The really exceptional thing about St. Lillian is how inclusive the environment is. No matter what, Asher is included. Asher is treated with dignity and respect. Asher is valued as a member of the community," she says. "It means so much to us that he doesn't get left behind simply because he doesn't speak."**

"They treat him as the whole person he is," she says.

# LOOKING AHEAD

## School Leaders Work With Leading Education Experts to Shepherd St. Lillian into the Future

The past year has seen a lot of transition for the St. Lillian community. When the opportunity to combine with Hope Academy emerged at the beginning of 2023, school leaders from both schools saw the potential that it presented both communities, but they wanted to ensure a successful transition for all students, families and staff.

“It was very important for us that the process was as intentional and thoughtful as possible,” says Elissa McKenzie, head of school.

Guiding them through this transition has been Attuned Education Partners. Elissa and Christine Whitlow, St. Lillian’s principal, had already been participating in the Attuned Incubator, a program to support school founders looking to grow their impact.

But in the wake of the decision to combine, their work pivoted to supporting merger planning designed to help the unified organization develop a vision for the future and a pathway to integration.

“Elissa and Christine are so growth-oriented at heart,” says Jessica Long, deputy chief of adult learning at Attuned. “They really threw themselves into thinking about how they could expand the impact of St. Lillian’s model to serve more students and families who need that type of unique education support.”

The result has been a highly intentional, evidence-based and systematic approach to the process of combining the schools that has retained the strengths, attributes, and instructional excellence of both schools while envisioning a new, combined school identity that could offer increased skills, more student experiences, more extracurricular activities, and more opportunities for post-secondary transition planning, support and programming beyond graduation.

“We’ve been very intentional in thinking about how we can use our additional resources to expand what we can offer our students,” says Elissa. “We don’t want to lose what makes our school unique—our nurturing family-like community, our integration of support services, our instructional excellence.

“As part of our process, we survey parents on how satisfied they are with the school, and St. Lillian received exceptionally high scores,” says Jessica. “It speaks to the exceptional culture and community of care the school has created. And that strong culture will continue to infuse everything St. Lillian does as they move into this exciting next phase.”
